
## GO SET A WATCHMAN - HARPER LEE

Most have read the classic 'To Kill a Mockingbird' that won Harper Lee a Pulitzer Prize two decades ago.

'Go Set A Watchman' was initially described as a sequel to Lee's best-selling novel To Kill A Mockingbird which was published in 1960. Go Set A Watchman is actually that novel's first draft. Lee described it as being more a series of antidotes than a fully conceived novel.

Mockingbird, in contrast, represents a determined effort to see both the bad and the good in life, the hatred and the humanity and it views the past not as something lost but as a treasured memory.

This book captures the era so brilliantly, as the political unrest and civil tensions brought out both the best and the worst in people. We see the reactions of different communities and how policies made to bring people together began to drive them apart.


Go Set a Watchman was by no means a perfect read, but it's left me thinking about so many decisions made in the world today.

# Book Gynopsis;

Pastor Dimas Salaberrios Tells How He Went from Being a God of the Street to Bringing God to the Streets in New Memoir, Street God

Dimas Salaberrios began dealing drugs at age fourteen. Known by all as "Daylight," he spent his days dealing, stealing, and gaining respect on the streets of Queens, New York, as a successful "businessman." His addiction to power and success led to poor choices, sending Dimas—twice—to New York City's Rikers Island, one of the toughest and most notorious jails in the nation. He narrowly escaped death numerous times, including when a vengeful hustler pointed a gun at his head at point-blank range and pulled the trigger. Dimas now acknowledges that, for every poor choice he made in his youth, God placed a barrier to redirect him, sent an angel to protect him, or provided a message to touch him. Dimas shares his story in his memoir, Street God: The Explosive Story of a Former Drug Boss on the Run from the Hood—and the Courageous Mission That Drove Him Back, which releases in South Africa in October through Christian Art Distributors.

Today Dimas is back on the streets, but rather than dealing drugs, he is showing people the way out of the hopelessness that keeps them rooted in self-destructive choices. He is the pastor of Infinity Bible Church, which targets at-risk, gang-involved youth and has spearheaded numerous outreach events, discipleship groups, and weekly prayer walks. These activities have been a factor in virtually eliminating homicides and other violent crimes in the Bronx River housing projects. The New York City police commissioner credited Pastor Dimas and Infinity for the notable drop in crime. The man who was once called "Daylight" is now bringing the light of the gospel into the darkness of the streets. Dimas says, "If I could risk so much for Satan, I'm gonna go all out for Jesus."


#### **Author Bio**
